ACRN RECERTIFICATION PROTOCOL

POLICY:

HANCB has developed protocols for recertification requirements to ensure ACRNs have continued to maintain competence and/or expand their HIV knowledge base within the four (4) year certification/recertification period. Recertification protocols will be reviewed at least once a year to determine if the requirements are complete and meet the goals of maintaining competence and/or enhancing HIV nursing practice.

PROTOCOL:

Certification Renewal by Continuing Nursing Education (CNE):

- Continuing Nursing Education (CNE) recertification includes a wide spectrum of continuing education activities performed
 by the HIV nurse. It includes both formal and informal education experienCNE for the HIV nurse. CNE are also granted for
 other activities such as HIV publications, presentations, and volunteer/leadership responsibilities.
- ACRN certification renewal by CNE is obtained by accumulating a total of 70 CNE within a 4-year period. A minimum of 35 CNE in Category I is required. The remaining 35 CNE can be accumulated in categories I IV, although there are limits to the number of CNE accepted in each of the remaining categories (II through IV).
- CNE must be accumulated during the 4-year recertification period. CNE obtained prior to initial ACRN certification cannot be applied towards recertification. Only CNE obtained after the date of initial certification can be applied towards recertification. A description of the acceptable continuing education activities can be found in Appendix A.
- HANCB will randomly audit a certain percentage of ACRN recertification applications. If audited, you will be asked to submit copies of certificates and other documents, as described in Appendix A, verifying your CNE activities with your renewal application. During each 4-year period, all ACRNs are encouraged to keep all documentation and be prepared to submit it upon request if audited. All applications are subject to audit at the discretion of the HANCB. Finally, non-audited ACRNs may be required to submit supporting evidence of recertification requirements at any time.
- It is important to notify the HANCB of any change in address and/or name. It is the responsibility of the renewing ACRN to submit all required documentation at the time of renewal. Failure to submit documentation as required may delay recertification.
