

ANAC has made great strides in programming and publications for members and non-members alike. Our collaboration with Georgetown on its Nurses SOAR! program has given our members unique opportunities to work in developing countries. Working with not only the World Health Organization, but also the International Council of Nurses and the International Association of Physicians in AIDS Care, ANAC was on the steering committee for the new task-shifting guidelines that were released in January. The Core Curriculum is undergoing its third revision and our HIV/AIDS Nursing Scope and Standards has been published.

ANAC continues to believe that every nurse is an HIV nurse. As such, it remains our goal to bring all HIV/AIDS nurses into our fold. We believe that when your members become part of a larger community of like-minded, dedicated caregivers, you create the energy that the world needs to continue the fight.

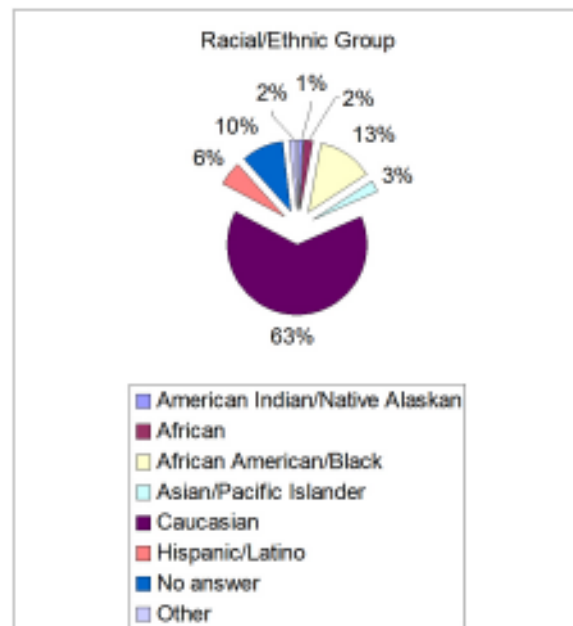
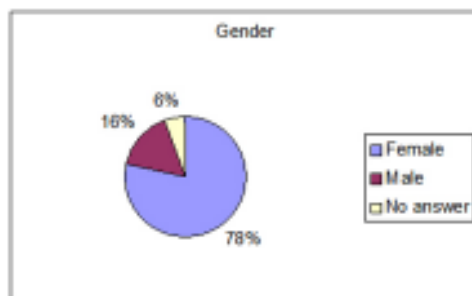
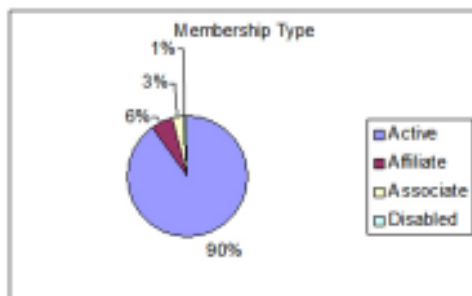
CORE PURPOSE

Strategic Goals

GOAL 1: PRIMARY RESOURCE: ANAC will be the primary resource for and provider of educational opportunities for all dimensions of HIV nursing, nationally and worldwide.

- ANAC provided nursing continuing education credits for the 4th IAS Conference on HIV Pathogenesis, Treatment and Prevention
- ANAC was a partner in the Forum for Collaborative Research and a member of the executive committee
- ANAC began work on the third edition of the HIV/AIDS Nursing Core Curriculum
- ANAC launched a redesigned website in November 2007

GOAL 2: MEMBER VALUE: Nurses working in any dimension of HIV disease will perceive value in ANAC membership.

- ANAC transitioned to an electronic voting system
- ANAC hosted the 2nd Biennial HIV Nursing Research Symposium entitled *20 Years of HIV Nursing Research: An Evolution of Evidence Based Practice*
- ANAC selected Lucy Bradley-Springer, PhD, RN, ACRN, FAAN as the new editor of the *Journal of the Association of Nurses in AIDS Care*

GOAL 3: POLICY INFLUENCE: ANAC and its members will be recognized as the primary nursing resource at the policy level for the promotion of the health, welfare and rights of all individuals living with HIV disease.

- ANAC endorsed the Global Campaign for Microbicide Development
- ANAC had representation at meetings of the Presidential Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS

- ANAC endorsed the following sign-on letters: Protection Against Transmission of HIV for Women and Youth Act of 2007, HIV/AIDS Program Request for FY2007 Joint Resolution, letter demanding the release of Bulgarian nurses from Libya, letter urging additional resources for healthcare worker capacity building in the FY2008 State/Foreign Operations Appropriations Bill, letter opposing the nomination of Dr. Holsinger for Surgeon General

- ANAC endorsed the HIV Prevention Act

- ANAC endorsed the Call to Action for a National AIDS Strategy

GOAL 4: GLOBAL NURSING: ANAC and its members will work internationally to develop HIV nursing competency and leadership in resource-challenged countries.

- ANAC members and chapters funded the travel of a nurse from Tanzania to attend ANAC's National Conference
- ANAC is working with Georgetown University as a subcontractor on a grant to strengthen the clinical and professional leadership capacity of nurses in three Southern African countries to provide HIV/AIDS services.

GOAL 5: ORGANIZATIONAL EFFECTIVENESS: ANAC's structure and processes will support the achievement of the envisioned future.

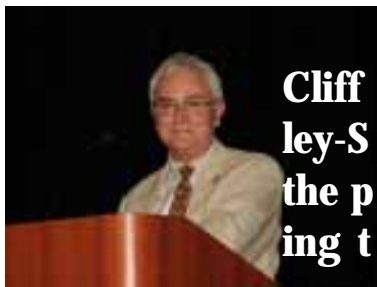
