ANAC 2024: Information for Claiming Nursing Contact Hours (CNE Credit)





The US Latino HIV Crisis – Ending an Era of Invisibility

While the country has made incredible overall progress toward Ending the HIV Epidemic, Latinos face a different reality. Between 2010 and 2022, there was an overall 19% decline in new HIV infections, but during the same period, Latinos experienced a 12% increase. In the United States, Latinos are the second-largest racial or ethnic group after Whites, and their share of the population is rapidly growing. Simply put, we cannot end our HIV epidemic without first ending the Latino HIV Crisis. This talk will provide context for the lack of HIV progress among Latinos and discuss opportunities to amplify the national response.

HIV Criminalization for Nursing Professionals

There is a national movement to end HIV criminalization, a term used to describe laws that criminalize otherwise legal conduct based on a person's HIV-positive status. Nationwide, thousands of PLWH have been arrested and prosecuted in recent decades. Medical experts, including ANAC and ANA, argue these laws do not align with current HIV science, add to stigma, and negatively impact health outcomes. This session provides an overview of the issue and identifies specific ways nursing professionals can support their clients affected by HIV criminal laws and help with reform efforts.

Tackling the Rise of STIs with Doxy-PEP

Bacterial sexually transmitted infections in the US are unrelenting, with 2.5 million diagnoses of chlamydia, gonorrhea, and syphilis reported in 2022. Although there have been some improvements in gonorrhea and chlamydia cases, syphilis is worsening. Most alarming is the number of congenital syphilis cases, signaling an urgent need for innovative prevention strategies. Doxycycline postexposure prophylaxis (doxy-PEP) is a novel STI intervention strategy that is highly effective in reducing bacterial STIs.




