Dear Colleagues, Partners and Friends:

The Association of Nurses in AIDS Care (ANAC) was formed in 1987 to provide education and support to HIV/AIDS nurses who work with and advocate for individuals infected with HIV. Our commitment to this ideology remains firm and is evidenced by our growing membership, record attendance at regional and national offerings, new chapters and our record of external support. ANAC members continue to represent a unique community of committed and passionate health care providers who are dedicated to preventing new HIV infections, caring for the chronically infected and generating or contributing to the science of HIV disease. Over the last few years, our nurse members have strengthened the nursing response to the global HIV/AIDS epidemic by serving as mentors, teachers, and sometimes caregivers to the global community of nurses in parts of South Africa, a country devastated by the HIV/AIDS pandemic. The success of this model and the impact it has had on HIV infected individuals and systems of care have allowed us to replicate its broad objectives in countries with similar needs, such as India. ANAC staff, members, and organizational leaders continue to be consultants to and partner with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the World Health Organization, Health Resources and Services Administration, the International Association of Physicians in AIDS Care; all testimony to an expanding sphere of influence. The ANAC Board of Directors has appropriated human and financial resources to ensure that the voice of nursing is represented on matters of domestic and international policies that affect the work we do or the care we give. ANAC scientists, researchers, clinicians and educators continue to expand and contribute to the knowledge base of HIV/AIDS through record contributions to the *Journal of Association of Nurses in AIDS Care (JANAC)*. The number of non-nursing and international contributors has grown significantly which is an indication of the value that our publication has to the broader HIV/AIDS community. Last year we published the third edition of our compendium of HIV nursing knowledge, *The HIV/AIDS Core Curriculum in Nursing*. This long awaited update, written by 90 nurse experts, resonates with our core strategic values. It has been a fantastic year and we are pleased to present to you our 2009 annual report. As you will, see 2009 has been a year of enormous activity and growth in the organization. Without our enormously committed members, the accomplishments highlighted in this document would not be possible. We owe an enormous gratitude to our members, partners, staff and volunteers who work tirelessly to make ANAC the force it has become.

Policy:

ANAC maintained full membership to AIDS Action Council, which included seats on both their Board of Directors and Public Policy Committee

On behalf of our members and their patients, ANAC advocated for health care reform, needle exchange programs, ADAP funding and health worker shortage issues.

Conference:

ANAC's 2010 Conference, "Remembering, Recommitting, Reaching, Reforming: Implications for the Future of HIV Nursing," Dawn Averitt Bridge, the Founder of the "Well Project" was our Keynote Speaker. There were varied topics and speakers, Jeff Crowley, Director, Office of National AIDS Policy, to a panel on "HIV Nursing Response to Natural Disasters." It was held at the Grand Sierra in Reno, Nevada, this setting provided an ideal place for this conference for our members to absorb information and network with each other.

The pre-conference, "Biomedical Strategies for HIV Prevention," focused on the latest information on community involvement and the development of pre-exposure treatment to community involvement.

A "ANAC Writers Workshop" was designed to help authors (new and experienced) develop manuscripts in ways that will increase the likelihood of publication, especially in the Journal of the Association of Nurses in AIDS Care.

A Grant Writing Workshop, "Getting Your Research Funded: A Workshop for Early Investigators" was designed to help junior faculty learn how to develop a competitive grant application and to assist them in envisioning a program of research.

International:

ANAC is represented with members and affiliates on six continents. ANAC Chapters exist in sub-Saharan Africa and as well as several developed countries. ANAC has implemented funded clinical mentoring programs, curriculum development, leadership development and policy improvement programs in Lesotho, Swaziland, South Africa, India and the Caribbean.
